Access Information



Getting to the museum

Disabled parking is available in the Load Street short stay car park (up to 3 hours) or Gardeners Meadow long stay car park.

There are two blue badge parking spaces directly outside the museum

The front entrance has double doors which may be difficult for some visitors to open. As an alternative visitors can access the museum via Jubilee Gardens where there are no doors to negotiate.

To enter the museum through the rear entrance use Gardners Meadow car park and enter Jubilee Gardens through the Lax Lane entrance.



There are two access ramps into the museum from these gardens – the ramp on the right hand side provides access to the café area, the one on the left is less steep and enters the herb garden.

An induction loop is available in the reception area and education rooms

A manual wheelchair is available for use free of charge.

Please be aware that some of the floor surfaces especially the Shambles and parts of the Brass Foundry are uneven and paved with cobbles.
